Class

- Follow school requirements for curriculum and syllabus, including content and assessment
- Plan, prepare, deliver and self-evaluate lessons that are creative, engaging and challenging
- Teach according to the education needs, abilities and goals of individual students (differentiation)
- Use a range of resources, activities and lessons that focus on <u>inquiry-based</u> and <u>student-centred</u> learning
- Assess, record and report on student development in knowledge, skills, understandings, social and emotional development
- Maintain order and focus in the classroom

- Follow registration procedures
- Undertake pastoral care duties, such as taking on the role of a form tutor and supporting students on an individual basis through academic or personal difficulties
